

MAKE A CONE ZONE

KNOW THE HAZARDS

- Slips, Trips or Falls
- Inhalation of Vapours or Smoke
- Musculoskeletal Injuries (MSI's)
- Stress
- Cuts or Burns
- Fire
- Moving Vehicles and Traffic

WEAR PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

- Hi-Vis Vest
- Gloves
- Safety Footwear

KEEP TOOLS ON HAND

- Fire Extinguisher
- First Aid Kit

SAFETY TIPS



Turn on **4-way flashers**



Wear **appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)**

Use **3-point contact while entering or exiting the cab**



Watch for **moving vehicles**



HOW TO MAKE A CONE ZONE

Warn drivers and pedestrians about your broken-down vehicle

1. STAY CALM

- ⊕ Assess the situation
- ⊕ Pull over to the side of the road
- ⊕ Avoid blocking traffic, if possible

2. STAY SAFE

- ⊕ Follow rules (PPE, 4-way flashers)
- ⊕ Exit the truck on the side away from traffic, if possible
- ⊕ Watch for vehicles when exiting

3. SECURE THE SCENE

- ⊕ Evenly space triangles / cones to direct traffic away from the scene
- ⊕ Place triangles as noted in the diagram

4. CALL DISPATCH

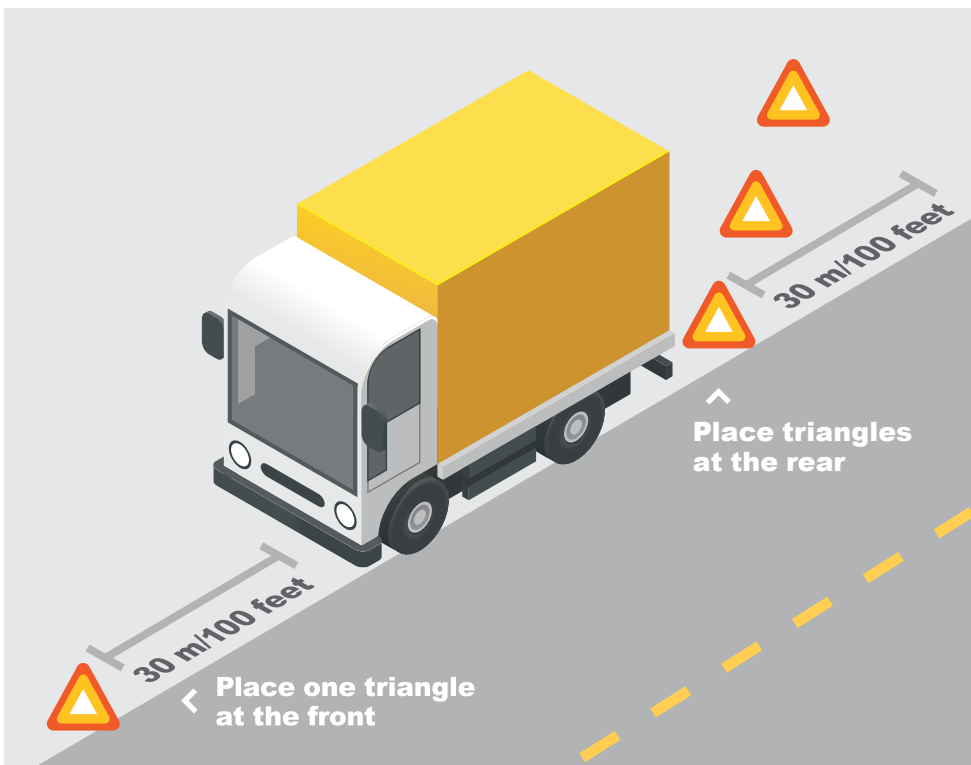
- ⊕ Advise your dispatcher / supervisor of the breakdown

5. WAIT FOR HELP

- ⊕ If it's safe, stay in your truck once you set up a cone zone
- ⊕ Do not wait in front of or behind the truck
