Turn on 4-way flashers

HOW TO MAKE

Warn drivers and pedestrians about your broken-down vehicle

1. STAY CALM

- Assess the situation
- Pull over to the side of the road
- Avoid blocking traffic, if possible

2. STAY SAFE

- Exit the truck on the side away from traffic, if possible
- Watch for vehicles when exiting

3. SECURE THE SCENE

- Evenly space triangles / cones to direct traffic away from the scene
- Place triangles as noted in the diagram

4. CALL DISPATCH

 Advise your dispatcher / supervisor of the breakdown

5. WAIT FOR HELP

- If it's safe, stay in your truck once you set up a cone zone
- Do not wait in front of or behind the truck
